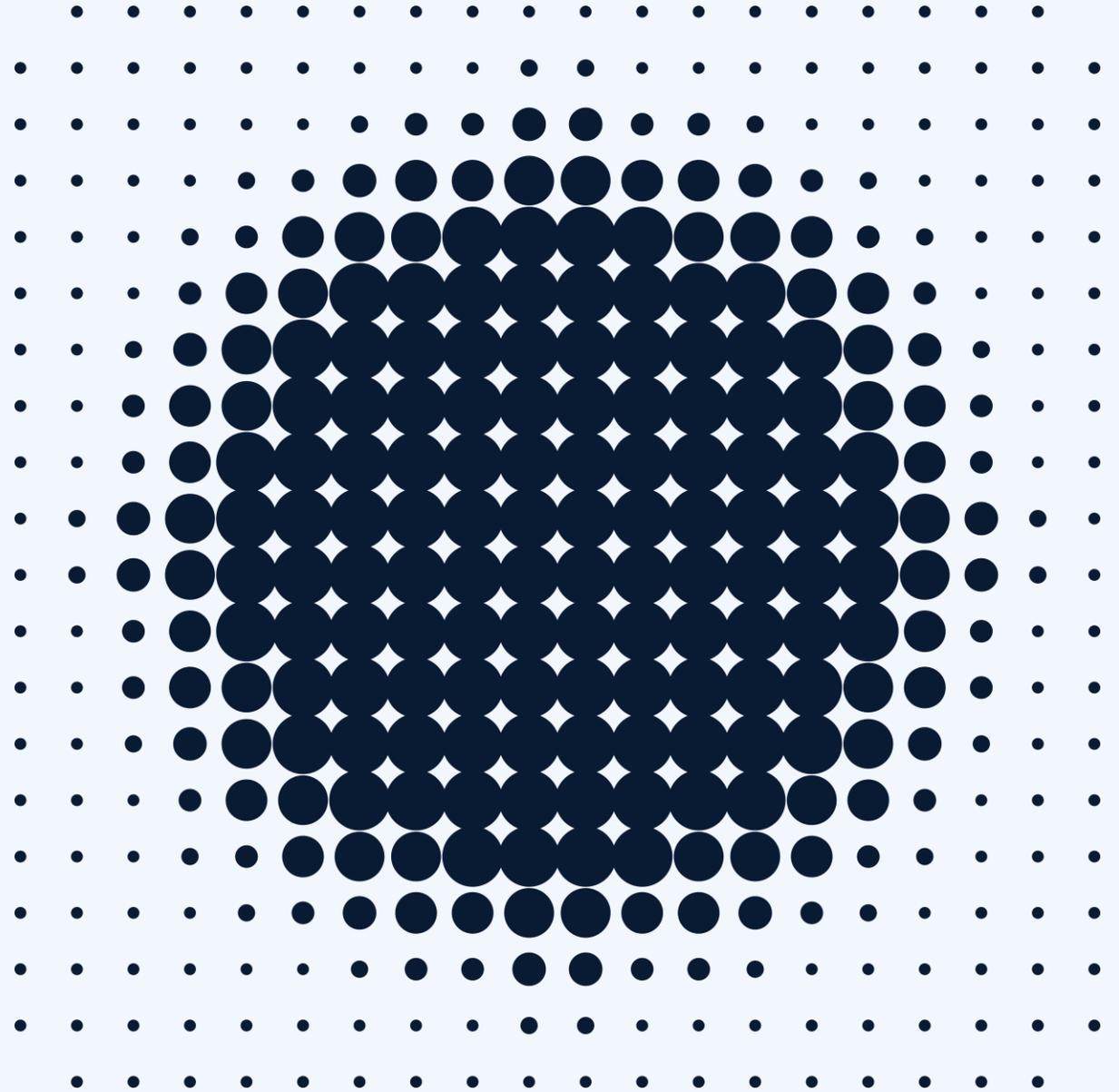

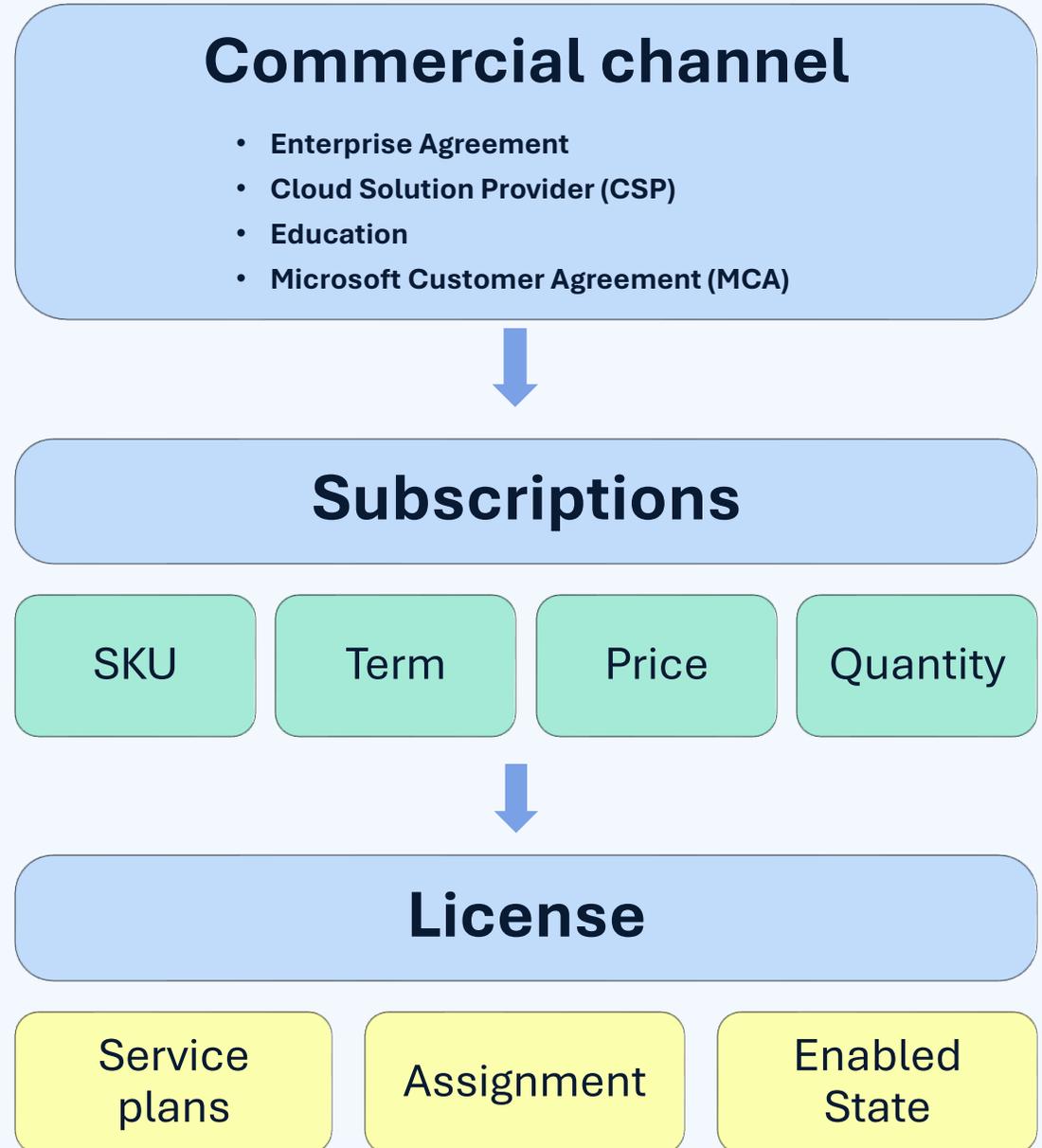

How Microsoft 365 licensing works in
the cloud



Subscriptions and Licenses

- Commercial layer
 - ✓ How you buy
- Subscription layer
 - ✓ What you purchase
- License layer
 - ✓ What is assigned to the user



What is a SKU?

- A SKU is the commercial license unit purchased in a subscription
- Each SKU contains one or more service plans
- A service plan represents an individual workload entitlement
- Service plans can be enabled or disabled

Example: Business Premium assigned to employees

- Business Premium is assigned to the group **LIC-Employees**
- SKU contains multiple apps (service plans)
- Some service plans intentionally disabled
- Enabled state defines real user experience

Eligibility to Assign Frontline Worker Licenses

Microsoft **Frontline Worker Licenses** may only be assigned to users who satisfy one or more of the following conditions:

- Uses a primary work device with a single screen smaller than 10.9", or
- Share their primary work device with other users licensed with a **Frontline Worker License**, during or across shifts.
 - Other users licensed with a **Frontline Worker License** must also use the device as their primary work device; and
 - Any software or service accessed from the shared device requires the device or users to be assigned a license that includes use of those software or services.

License Reassignment

Most, but not all, SLs may be reassigned. Except as permitted in this paragraph or in the Online Service-specific Terms, Customer may not reassign an SL on a short-term basis (i.e., within **90 days** of the last assignment). Customer may reassign an SL on a short-term basis to cover a user's absence or the unavailability of a device that is out of service. Reassignment of an SL for any other purpose must be for the remaining term of that License. When Customer reassigns an SL from one device or user to another, Customer must block access and remove any related software from the former device or from the former user's device.

How can the service be applied only to users in the tenant who are licensed for the service?

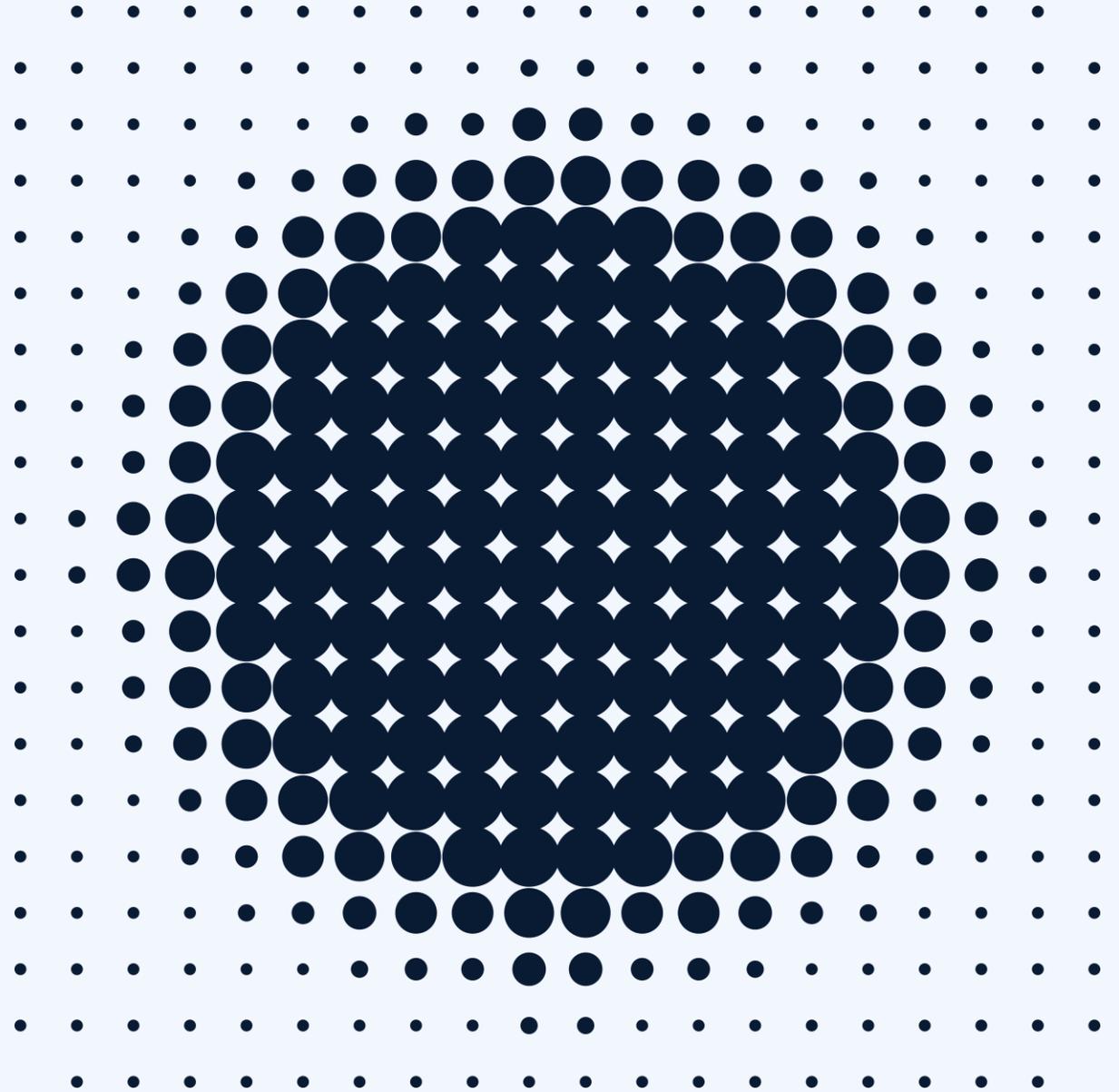
Admins can scope Microsoft Entra ID Protection by assigning risk policies that define the level for password resets and allowing access for licensed users only. For instructions on how to scope Microsoft Entra ID Protection deployments, see [How to configure and enable risk policies](#).

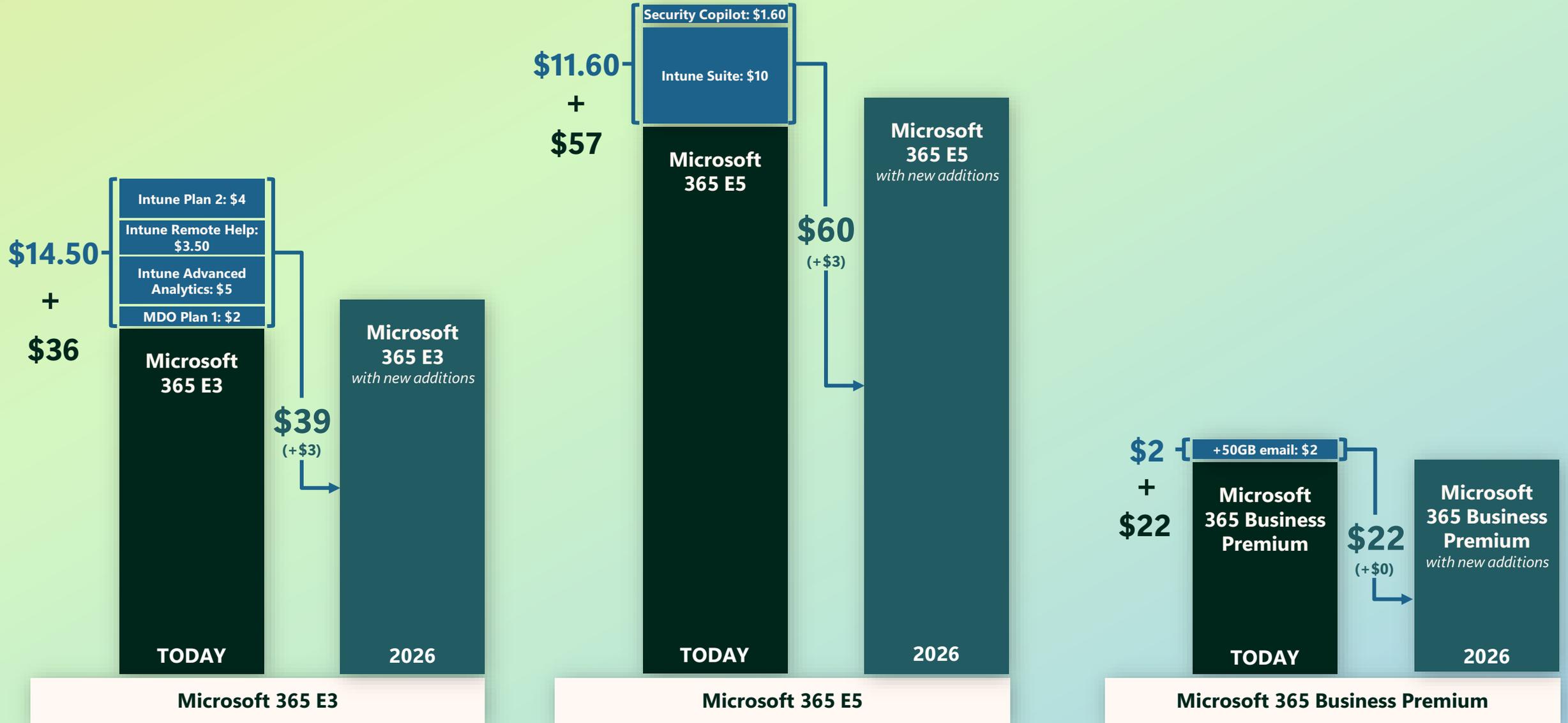

This update reduces complexity and allows more customers to benefit from the latest innovations in security as part of their subscription.



The 2025 pricing reflects the cost of Microsoft 365 E3, Microsoft 365 E5, and Microsoft 365 Business Premium suites plus the separate purchase of advanced security and management features required to achieve the same capabilities that will be included by default in 2026. After rolling out in 2026, these capabilities will be bundled into the core suites at a new, simplified price.

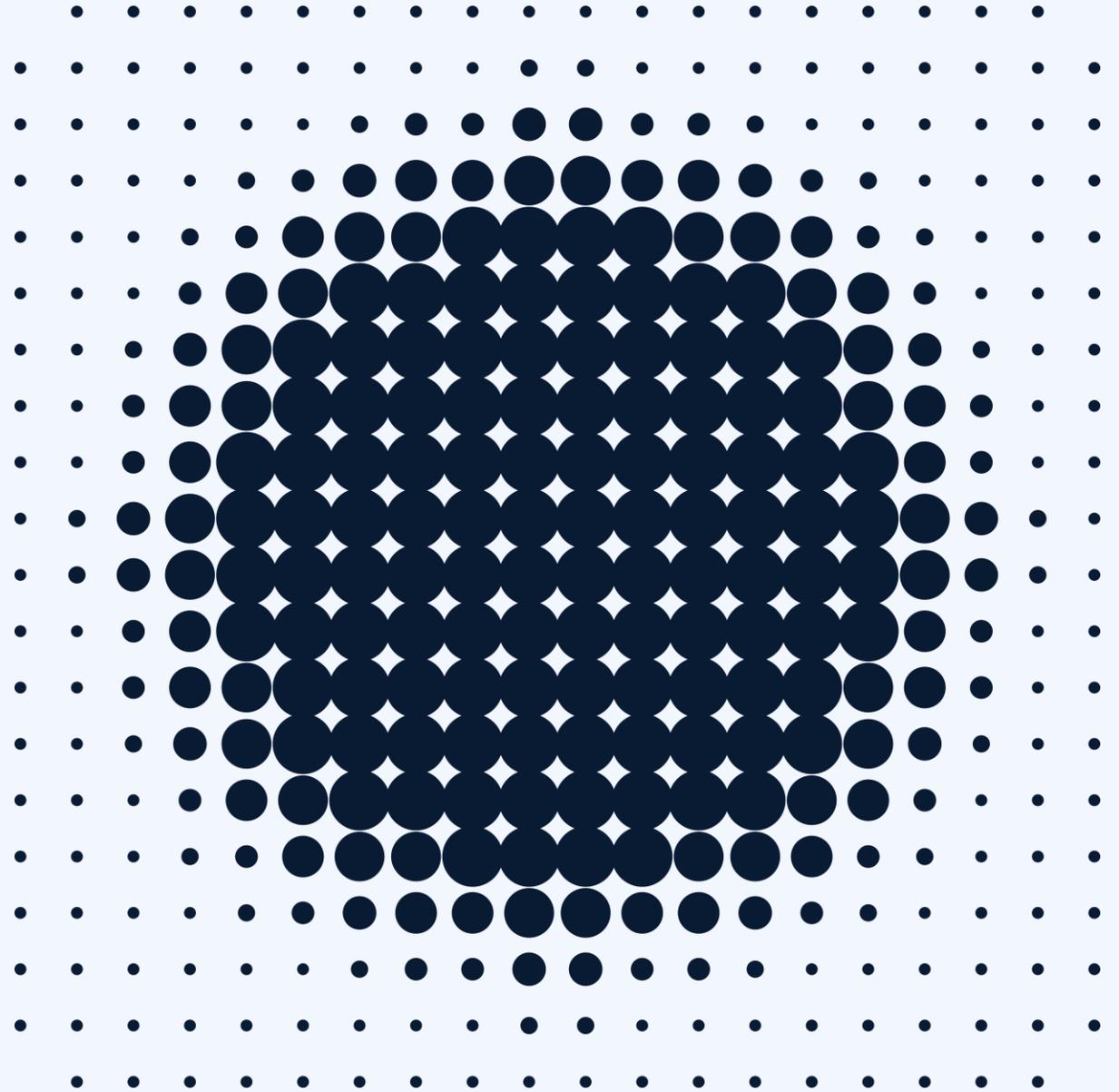

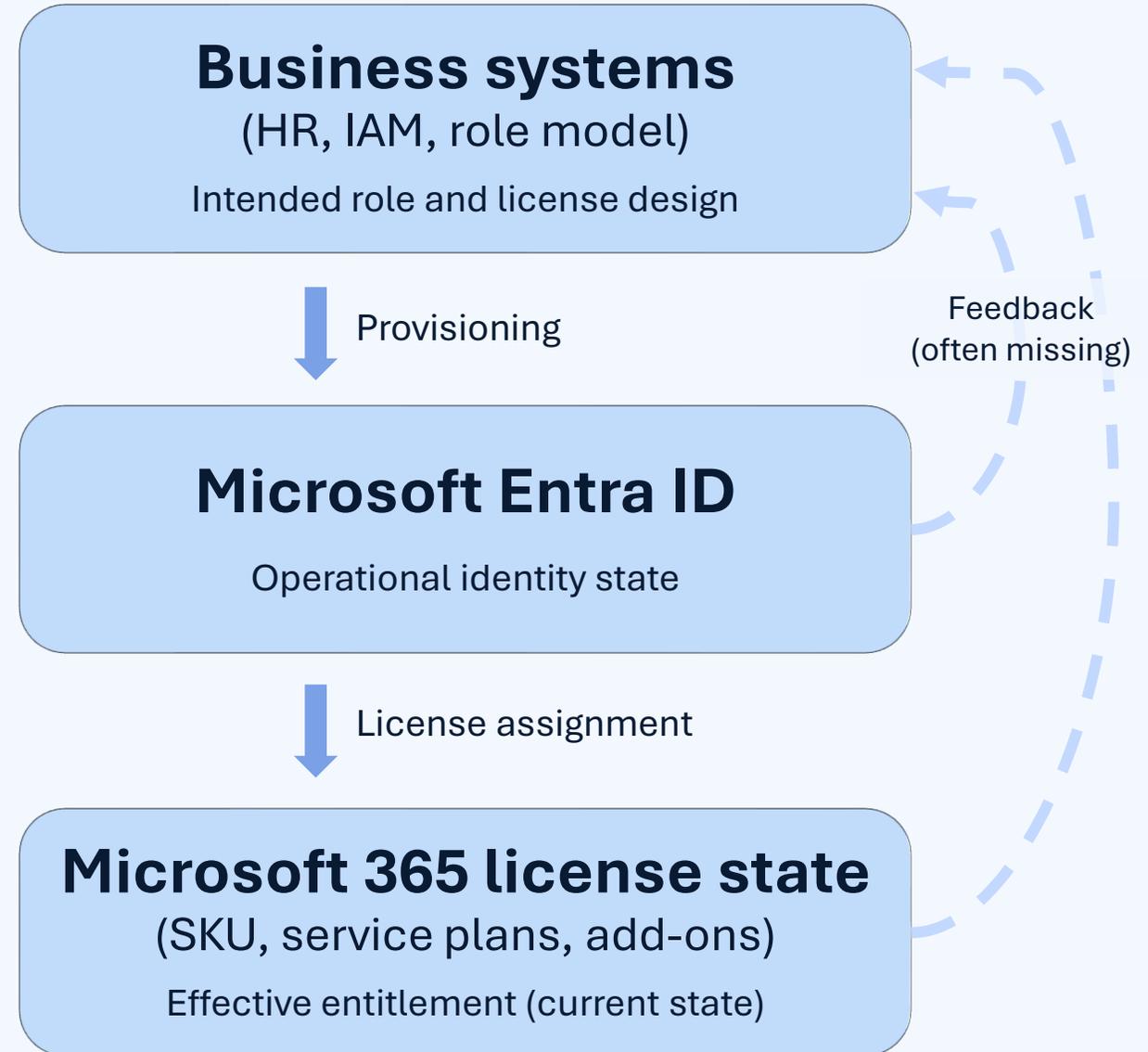


Common patterns of Microsoft 365 over-licensing

- Never signed in users being licensed
- Inactive users still hold premium licenses
- Disabled users remain licensed
- Test, shared, rooms, or admin accounts licensed unnecessarily
- Users licensed at a higher tier than required, e.g. E3 instead of F3
- Unused standalone licenses, e.g. Project, Visio, Power BI
- Overlapping licenses, e.g. Microsoft 365 E3 + F3, E5 + Power BI Pro
- Purchased licenses remain unassigned due to renewal overestimation

Role design vs. operational reality

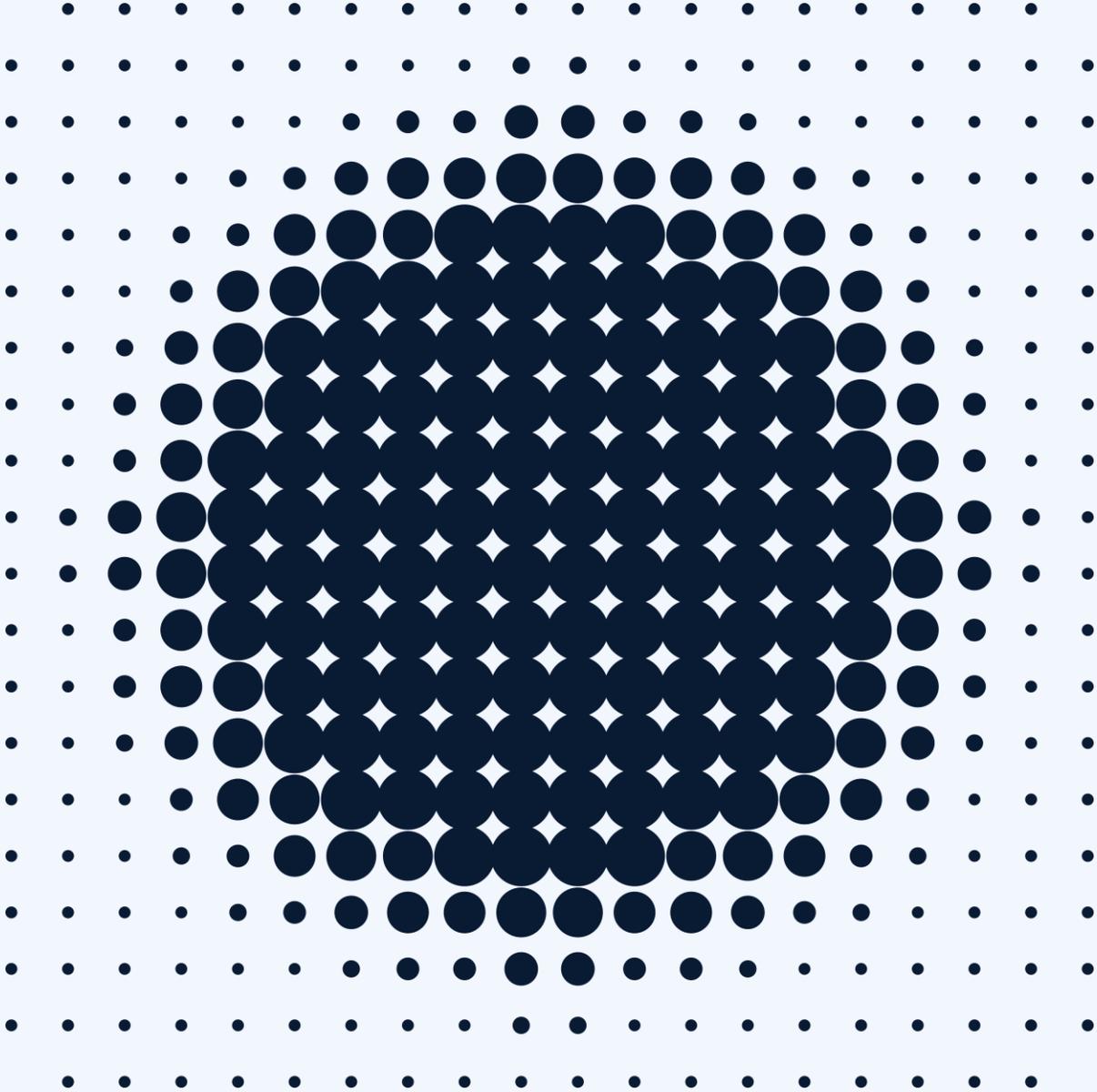
- License models are built on assumptions
- Real usage often differs
- Usage continues to evolve
- Limited visibility

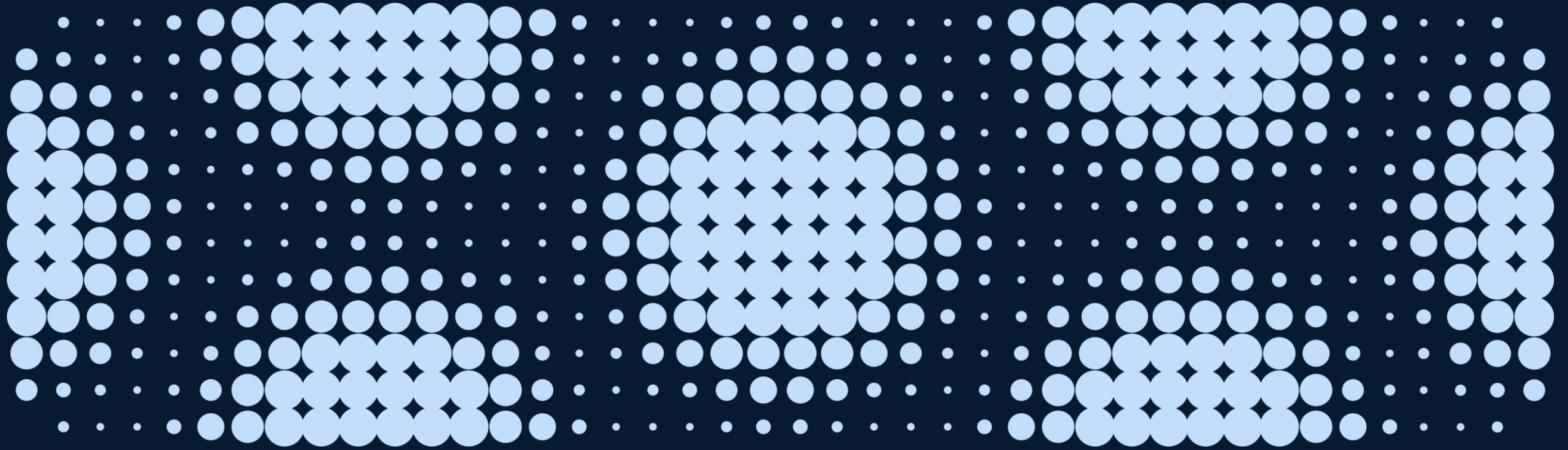
